





Teacher's Activity Guide

It's never too early to start teaching students about self-love and encouraging positive self-esteem. This activity and challenge is a stepping stone towards this very important topic. Here are some great picture books and YouTube videos you can use to introduce your lesson as well.

Lesson Plan

Duration: 60-90 Minutes. This can be broken into 2-3 sessions depending on the time you have available.

Grade Levels: 1st-4th

Supplies: Pencils, eraser, crayons, colored pencils or markers, stapler or tape

Start with a conversation about self-love. Possible questions can include:

- What does self-love mean?
- * What is the difference between self-love and selfish?
- What are some things you love about other people?
- What are some things you love about yourself on the inside and the outside?

Optional: Use a suggested picture book or YouTube video to help students understand the concept more.

Have students brainstorm a list of things they love about themselves. They can write physical features, character traits, or emotional awareness.

Optional: Review different types of poems. Help students understand that sometimes poems rhyme, but they don't always need to. Here's a great list of different types of poems for kids from <u>Penlighten</u>.

Allow students time to work on writing their poem. Students could work with a partner to discuss ideas for their poems as well.

Students can go through the writing process with this assignment, or not. It's completely up to what works best for you.

Students illustrate a picture to go with their poem.

At the end, students can make a bracelet by writing one thing they love about themselves on the line and decorating the rest of the paper strip. You can staple or tape the ends of the strip of paper together on the child's wrist to make a bracelet that they can wear and take home.
